

Helping Lost Animals



Losing a pet can be a devastating experience to any individual or family. Your local city government and public safety departments have set up resources for lost pets to find their way home. If you are a pet owner, we strongly encourage you to get involved in the safety of your pet by participating in our programs. Keep in mind some of these programs are a requirement to be a pet owner in Chanhassen.

Have a City License for Dogs and Cats

All dogs and cats over the age of six (6) months must have a license purchased from the City of Chanhassen (ordinance 5-51).

Why do I have to do this?

- Helps law enforcement bring lost pets home
- Decreases or eliminates impound fees
- It's required by the City of Chanhassen

How do I get a city license?

- Go to Chanhassen City Hall (7700 Market Blvd.) during business hours. Mon-Fri 8:00am-4:30pm
- Remember to bring a current rabies certificate as well

What are the costs for a license?

- Dogs: \$6.00 if neutered or spayed, \$10.00 if not
- Cats: \$1.50 if neutered or spayed, \$3.00 if not
- Licenses expire annually the month rabies vaccinations are given

Keep collar, city license tag, and identification on your pet AT ALL TIMES!

- Your lost pet can be identified and returned faster
- Significantly decreases the chances of your pet being lost
- This includes cats too!



Report Animal Control Violations

If you see a violation of Chanhassen animal ordinances in progress, report them to the Carver County Sheriffs Office immediately. If you wish to report a previous animal violation or an ongoing animal issue, contact Chanhassen Animal Control at 952-227-1607.



All Animal Bites MUST be Reported!

In order to maintain public health and safety, all persons involved in animal bite incidents (no matter how minor) must be reported to Chanhassen Animal Control. Proper documentation is necessary for rabies control and aggressive animal issues.
